

This scorecard includes votes from bills that represent PPAMT legislative priorities, descriptions of bills passed, and updated notices on the status of bills, as of August 2023.


We're extremely grateful to all of our partners including the Montana Sexual and Reproductive Health Collective and the Free and Fair Coalition,

### **A Note from Our Leaders**





With the number of bills passed this legislative session, it feels difficult to summarize exactly what happened during the 2023 Montana Legislative Session. We won't sugarcoat things: The 2023 session showed Montanans that lawmakers are working against the best interests of everyday folks. By working tooth and nail to dial back the rights of women, LGBTQIA2S+communities, BIPOC communities, working families, and folks receiving public assistance benefits like Medicaid, the Montana GOP worked relentlessly to pass unpopular laws that create barriers to healthy, thriving communities for the majority of Montanans.

While some victories can be celebrated, Planned Parenthood Advocates of Montana (PPAMT) recognizes how many harmful bills moved through both chambers and eventually made it in front of the Governor's pen; the tone and tenor of hearings; and the overall impact to Montana communities. After the session and Gov. Gianforte signing into law some of the most harmful anti-abortion and anti-trans legislation in the country, it's important to reiterate that abortion care is still legal and safe in Montana. Patients in the state have seen no changes in abortion access due to litigation on bills that were signed, and one Department of Health and Human Services rule that would have effectively ruled out Medicaid recipients' access to abortion care. Montanans need to know that we can still access safe, legal abortion, and Medicaid patients can utilize benefits to do so.

Collectively with partners and legislators, we successfully saw three harmful anti-abortion bills tabled in the House Human Services Committee; HB720 'Determination of Life', HB873 'Disposal of Fetal Remains' and HB879 'Fund Post-Abortion Counseling Program', one vetoed by Governor Gianforte; HB968 'Revise Abortion Laws Concerning Parental Consultation', and HJ33 'Study Abortion Complications', a study bill that never made it to 2nd Reading on the Senate Floor because of an early motion to Sine Die. Additionally, we were watching two potential constitutional amendments that

were never introduced but could have had significant consequences to patient care. In a significant win, Rep. Alice Buckley's HB302, 'Insurance Coverage for 12-Month Supply of Birth Control' passed and was signed by the Governor.

So, while it was a difficult legislative session, it was not without celebration and some big sighs of relief. We thank you for your support and hope this legislative scorecard aids you in understanding these issues and how Montana's elected officials shape the landscape of reproductive and sexual health care for Montanans. We are grateful to work an behalf of all Montanans and we will never stop fighting for your rights and futures.

# **HB302 Insurance Coverage for 12-Month Supply of Birth Control**

Sponsored by Rep. Alice Buckley (D), HD63, Bozeman Carried by Rep. Mary Caferro (D) and Sen. Jason Small (R) PPAMT Supported Bill passed and signed into law

HB302 requires insurance coverage of a 12-month supply of prescription birth control, including any covered drug, device, or product for contraception.

#### **HB303 Implement Medical Ethics and Diversity Act**

Sponsored by Rep. Amy Regier (R), HD6, Kalispell Carried by Sen. Tom McGillvray (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB303 allows any medical provider, medical institution and/or insurer to deny care to any person for any reason based on religious, ethical, or moral reasons. It's a very broadly written bill that could allow any person who works at a facility, from a janitor, front desk scheduler, surgery tech, or physician, to deny care.

### **HB359 Prohibit Minors from Attending Drag Shows**

Rep. Braxton Mitchell (R), HD3, Columbia Falls Carried by Sen. Keith Regier (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation

HB359 prohibits parents from bringing their children to age-appropriate drag shows that occur in public places, schools, and libraries. If a business serves alcohol, holds a drag show, and children are present, they are required to establish themselves as a "sexually oriented business."

# HB361 Provide That Use of A Name and Sex by A Student is Not Discrimination

Rep. Brandon Ler (R), HD35, Savage Carried by Sen. Keith Regier (R) PAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB361 makes the dead-naming and mis-gender trans, nonbinary, or two-spirit peers legal.

## HB544 Provide Requirements for Coverage of Abortion Under Medicaid and CHIP

Rep. Jane Gillette (R), HD64, Bozeman Carried by Sen. Becky Beard (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation, law not in effect

HB544 requires prior authorization by a physician to access abortion care with Medicaid. In order to receive prior authorization, a physical exam must be performed in person, by a physician - despite Advanced Practice Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants being trained and qualified to perform abortions.

#### **HB575 Prohibit Abortion of Unborn Viable Children**

Rep. Lola Sheldon-Galloway (R), HD22, Great Falls
Carried by Sen. Daniel Emrich (R)
PPAMT Opposed
Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation, law not in effect

HB575 requires a physician or physician assistant to put in writing the determination of viability and provide that to the patient. The bill was amended to add a mandatory ultrasound to the physician's determination of viability. This bill essentially erases telehealth abortion care, given that an in-person physical exam is mandated.

#### **HB625 Infant Safety and Care Act**

Sponsored by Rep. Kerri Seekins-Crowe (R), HD43, Billings Carried by Sen. Keith Regier (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB625 is redundant of law homicide and infanticide already in the Montana code homicide and infanticide). This bill was amended so it would only apply to an infant who survives an abortion. The language is offensive to medical providers implying they would leave some infants without life-saving care, while providing care to others. Additionally, this bill is nearly identical to a ballot measure voted down by the people of Montana in 2022.

#### **HB676 Revise Laws to Clarify Fundamental Parental Rights**

Sponsored by Rep. Kerri Seekins-Crowe (R), HD43, Billings Carried by Sen. Keith Regier (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB676 is a parental rights bill with strict oversight of youth activities in school, activities, education and health care. This law impacts a young person's ability access certain reproductive health care options without a parents involvement

#### **HB721 Restrict Unborn Children from Dismemberment Abortion**

Sponsored by Rep. and House Speaker Matt Regier (R), HD4, Kalispell Carried by Sen. Steve Hinebauch (R)
PPAMT Opposed
Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation, law not in effect

HB721 bans the safest, most common method of abortion after 15 weeks. This is a drastic measure that represents just one of many efforts by politicians to severely limit a pregnant person's right to access abortion – or eliminate it entirely. This bill impacts access to abortion care at large, as well as miscarriage care.

# HB786 Revise Laws to Require Reporting of Individuals Harmed by Abortion Pills

Sponsored by Rep. Lola Sheldon-Galloway (R), HD22, Great Falls Carried by Sen. Theresa Manzella (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB786 adds additional, medication abortion-specific reporting requirements to the state's existing abortion reporting statute. Specifically, this bill requires additional record keeping and reporting of "any adverse side effects" experienced by a person that is prescribed medication abortion pills. Under the current language, a provider could face fines, reprimand, other sanctions, and license suspension for up to one year for being outside of compliance. This bill is redundant to existing reporting statutes and seeks to stigmatize medication abortion as being unsafe, despite decades of safety records from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

#### **HB862 Prohobit Use of Public Funds for Abortion and Exceptions**

Sponsored by Rep. Mike Hopkins (R), HD92, Missoula Carried by Sen. Carl Glimm (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation, law not in effect

HB862 is a functional ban on abortion care access for thousands of Montanans who receive Medicaid benefits.

#### **HB937 Provide for Licensure of Abortion Clinics**

Sponsored by Rep. Lola Sheldon-Galloway (R), HD22, Great Falls Carried by Sen. Theresa Manzella (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

HB937 singles out health centers that provide abortion services for licensure through Department of Public Health and Human Services, and would require additional information and reporting. This is a Targeted Regulation of Abortion Providers or TRAP law that singles out health centers that provide abortion services for licensure through the Department of Public Health and Human Services.

#### **HB968 Revise Abortion Laws Concerning Parental Consultation**

Sponsored by Rep. Amy Regier (R), HD6, Kalispell Carried by Sen. Keith Regier (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and vetoed by Governor Gianforte

HB968 removes the Parental Consent for Abortion Act, which has been ruled unconstitutional, and replaces it with a Consultation for Minor's Abortion Act of 2023. The bill heavily limits rights for minors despite their constitutional protections.

#### **SB99 Provide for a Youth Health Protection Act**

Sponsored by Sen. John Fuller (R), SD4, Whitefish Carried by Rep. Kerri Seekins-Crowe (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation

SB99 bans gender affirming care for trans, non-binary and two-spirit youth under 18, including hormone replacement therapy, puberty blockers and mental health services. The bill also places restrictions on publicly funded spaces and on public employees in how they can support a social transition of a trans, non-binary, or two-spirit youth under 18.

#### SB154 Define the Right to Privacy to Clarify No Right to Abortion

Sponsored by Sen. Keith Regier (R), SD3, Kalispell Carried by Rep. Lola Sheldon-Galloway (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

SB154 is two sentences long and simply states that within the Constitution's Privacy Provision, the Right to Abortion shall be prohibited. The passing of this law does not alter the Montana Constitution, or tamper with Montanans' rights to privacy or abortion. The Legislature does not have the authority to change the Montana Constitution with a statutory bill.

#### **SB458 Define Sex in Montana Law**

Sponsored by Sen. Carl Glimm (R), SD2, Kila Carried by Rep. Amy Regier (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law, facing litigation, law not in effect

SB458 implements archaic, rigid definitions of 'male' and 'female' for cisgender only people. This bill defines people's sex based on their reproductive capacity and internal reproductive organs. With more than 60 pages, the bill touches over 40 areas of Montana code. In function, SB458 legislates out of legal existence trans, nonbinary, two-spirit and intersex people from state law, opening the door for discrimination, lack of legal footing, and harmful avenues of forced mis-gendering of oneself to adhere to the of law.

# SB518 Revise Parental Rights Laws to Increase Parental Involvement in Education

Sponsored by Sen. Theresa Manzella (R), SD44, Hamilton Carried by Rep. Lee Deming (R) PPAMT Opposed Bill passed and signed into law

SB518 has mandates the ability of parents to withdraw students from school instruction on the basis of religious belief, requires schools to provide parents information on education materials, and prohibits public school employees from maintaining student-shared information that occurs at school and school-related activities. The law carries harmful repercussions for trans, non-binary and two-spirit youths as personal information can be made available to parents.
